Camping practices on public land ---- Highlights

Article 2.3 Terminology

Recreational camping : A temporary visit which includes camping equipment

Camping equipment : Equipment, specifically designed for the activity of camping. This equipment is mobile, temporary and not attached to the ground, and consists exclusively of: a tent, a trailer, a tent-trailer, and/or a motorised camper (R.V.). All camping equipment, with the exception of tents, must be plated in accordance with the Québec Highway Safety Code (Chapter C-24.2). In addition, the camping equipment must always have its integral parts (wheels, fasteners, etc.) allowing it to be mobile at all times.

Deck : An equipment, consisting of an uncovered platform, laid on the ground or not and movable not exceeding an area of 3,0 square meters, to communicate with the interior of the camping equipment by one or more doors.

Article 3.3 Recreational camping period

The authorised camping period shall be from May 1st to October 31st of each year, and its duration may not exceed 180 days. Despite the preceding, a short camping visit in a tent (less than 30 days) is also authorized from November 1st to April 30th of each year.

Article 3.4 Information and documents required at the request of a camping permit

The completed application form; the location of the site, such as the gps coordinates of said site; recent photos of the camping equipment that will be used, one of which to show the affixed license plate, if applicable; length of the stay; valid registration certificate for the camping equipment, if applicable; Any other relevant information.

Article 4.1 Camping bans

Recreational camping is prohibited:

Within 60 meters of the natural high-water mark of a permanent water body or watercourse or within 15 meters of intermittent watercourses within the territory of application of the following sites of wildlife interest: Lac Dumont, Lac Duval, Lac Bruce and Lac Galarneau.;

Recreational camping is also prohibited :

- b) on any island, unless a tent is used and for a period of less than 30 days;
- c) less than 100.0 meters from any body of water having a problem with cyanobacteria (blue algae);
- d) less than 25.0 meters from the natural high-water mark of any lake or stream;
- e) less than 100.0 meters from all public accesses to a lake or stream;
- f) less than 500.0 meters from any cottage/camp lease location;
- g) within 30.0 meters of any Class 1 or II multi use forestry road.

Article 4.2 Conditions relating to the practices and locations of camping

The holder of a camping permit must respect the following conditions of practice:

Disposal of its sewage in accordance with the By-law Respecting the Evacuation and Sewage Treatment of Isolated Dwellings (paragraphs Q-2, R.22); It is forbidden to set up an outhouse (dry toilet) by one's own means;

No deforestation, landscaping, excavation or backfilling may be done;

Camping equipment must never be installed within the right-of-way of a multiuse forestry road, pathway or any landing zone or to limit the circulation of other users of the forest; The camping permit from the MRC must be posted and visible on the premises.

Article 4.3 Authorized equipment and accessories

Only the following camping accessories are permitted on camp sites : A mobile deck with a maximum of **3 square meters**; Sanitary equipment suitable for rustic camping and the systems emptied in an appropriate manner.

Article 4.4 Vacating recreational camping sites

When the visit is complete, the camper must completely vacate the recreational camp site of all their equipment including accessories. The camper must advise the MRC of their departure and forward the issued permit along with photos of the site, duly vacated. It is prohibited to keep camping equipment on crown lands over the winter months, notably from November 1st to April 30 the following year. Despite the preceding statement, a short camping visit in a tent (less than 30 days) is also authorized from November 1st to April 30th of each year.

Article 4.5 Cleanliness and waste

Campers must use septic systems that are consistent with their RVs and take responsibility for having their systems drained in an appropriate manner. Campers must at all times maintain the cleanliness of their recreational camp site, as in free of debris and garbage. At the end of the visit, the campers must clean and put the camp site back to its original state. All garbage must be picked up and disposed of at appropriate locations, such as a garbage reception site or door-to-door collection organized by a municipality.

Article 5.1 Offences punishable by fines

Anyone who contravenes by-law 253-2019 is guilty of an offense, and is liable to a fine. They may have their camping permit revoked following a notice. A minimum fine of 300\$ and maximum of 1 000\$, plus fees, in the case of a physical person, and 500\$ to 2 000\$, plus fees, for a legal body. For a second offense, fines range from 500\$ to 2000\$ plus fees for a physical person and 2000\$ to 4000\$ plus fees for a legal body. If an infraction should last for more than one day, each day that the said infraction is committed constitutes as a separate offense and the penalties imposed for each offense may be imposed for each day that the offense continues, in accordance with this article.
